# SC State Chili Cook-off Championship RULES

You must bring all items needed. We provide the asphalt. No electricity will be provided.

## Amateur People's Choice Chili Rules

Entrants:

1. Must not be affiliated or tied to organizations that could influence voting.
2. Must not be a current ICS (International Chili Society) member in any category.
3. Must provide at minimum 3 gallons of chili for public samples (sample cups and spoons will be provided). Remember, the more chili you have that last through the day, the better chance you have at getting votes
4. Must provide their own tents, tables and heating elements. No electricity will be provided. Heat source should be some type of propane burner or stove.
5. Should encourage the public to come to sample their chili and entice them to vote for them in some form or fashion
6. Must not bribe, or prearrange a vote swing via collusion.
7. Must set-up from 7-9am
8. All tents and tables must remain up until 3:30pm
9. Must not share voting tokens with other competitors. Anyone caught doing so will be automatically disqualified.
10. You have a right to have one member of your team present when tokens are officially counted.
11. Any style of chili is welcome as long as it contains any one of the following: Beef, Pork or Chicken. All meats used must come from a grocery store or USDA approved seller. You must not use wild game that has been personally harvested.
12. Must protect foods from contamination
13. When reheating the chili prior to public consumption, the temperature of the chili must rise to above 165 degrees and kept at a minimum of 135 degrees
14. Only give samples to the ones who exchange a ticket or are wearing wristbands.
15. One token means one vote
16. Serving time will be 11:30-3:30 at which time the tokens will be gathered.
17. Organizers have the right to disqualify individuals based on information leading to the belief that cheating is involved.

**Organizational People's Choice Chili Rules**(Organizations would fall into the Organizational Championship Category. This would include Churches, Fire and Police Departments, businesses, restaurants, schools, teams, Non-Profits and the likes thereof.)

2. Must not be a current ICS (International Chili Society) member in any category.
3. Must provide at minimum 3 gallons of chili for public samples (sample cups and spoons will be provided). Remember, the more chili you have that last through the day, the better chance you have at getting votes
4. Must provide their own tents, tables and heating elements. No electricity will be provided. Heat source should be some type of propane burner or stove.
5. Should encourage the public to come to sample their chili and entice them to vote for them in some form or fashion
6. Must not bribe, or prearrange a vote swing via collusion.
7. Must set-up from 7-9am
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
